- Drug/Medication Review - staff pharmacists will review medications for possible drug duplication, harmful interaction, etc., and notify of any problems.
- EMT Care Link - Health professionals can access patient information via web, phone or fax.
- Decals, card key tags, wallet card, ID necklace provided.
- USB flash drive optional.
